What is the difference between a coalition *Member* and *Supporter*?

A coalition *member* is actively involved with a work group, while a *supporter* is supportive of the work of the coalition and may be called upon during times of need. For example, a business owner may be asked to support a CTC event or program by donating food, prizes, printing, discounted rates for services, etc.; or a group may be asked to volunteer their time to man a booth or work at a CTC event; a parent or grandparent may be called upon to bake cookies for a meeting or event.

How much time is required to be involved on a CTC Work Group?

Work Groups generally meet once a month, and in some cases, once every 3 months. Active members may expect to attend meetings and volunteer about one hour a month. Members with more time may choose to volunteer for additional work group activities.
