Cindi brought a typed copy of her analysis of her assigned factors – FH of Antisocial Behavior and Interaction with Prosocial Peers (Peer/Individual domain). She summarized the comparison with 2014 data as well as delving into the 2017 questions specific to those factors. The suggestion was made that she look at the 2014 and 2017 question-specific data for any extremes and if there are any, to review those differences in a little more depth.

Cindi brought the stats for the school drop-out rate which showed L'Anse school drop-out rate to be significant improved between 2014 and 2016 and the Baraga school drop-out rate to be worse. The drop-out rate for the state improved from 2014 to 2016 and both Baraga and L'Anse school drop-out rates remained below the state rate.

Sherry brought the new data for suicides in Baraga County which showed no suicides under 25 years of age for 2015 and 2016. The adult suicide rates were not significantly worse than they were for 2010-2014. However, the data was in raw format and wasn't in a summarized typed version.

Sherry brought the comparison data for the questions that related to depression (Q45-48) which actually showed improvement between the 2014 survey data and the 2017 survey data. This was also in raw format, not in a summarized typed version.

Sherry has started looking at the questions for her assigned factors (Low Commitment to School and Perceived Availability of Handguns) but did not get very far and what she had was in raw, unprinted format.

Terry just received her assignments today and hasn't had a chance to do much with them as yet (Perceived Risk of Drug Use and Prosocial Involvement (Peer/Individual domain)).

Ray has not sent the stats on Teen Pregnancies as yet.

Cindi looked at some of the data survey reports, specifically looking for the ones that have comparisons to previous years' surveys. She brought a very brief version, which we looked at. We also looked at our report from 2014.

Suggestions that were made included making an appendix for the stats that we reviewed (suicide, teen pregnancies, drop-out rates), even if they don't end up being factors we choose to focus on.

For next week, Cindi will find the Key Accomplishments for the CTC from 1/2015 until current. Sherry will update the rest of the Introduction for the 2017 data survey report we will end up with.

Sherry will finish the Suicide data and bring it in typed, printed format.
Sherry will finish the Depression questions and bring it in typed, printed format.
Sherry will do her assigned factors and try to bring them in typed, printed format.

Terry will start her assigned factors and bring at least the raw data to the next meeting.
